REVISION OF "HANDLING RADIOACTIVE WASTES
IN THE ATOMIC ENERGY PROGRAM"

Report by the Director of Information Services

1. The special report on "Handling Radioactive Wastes in the Atomic Energy Program" has been revised and brought up-to-date for reissue by the Government Printing Office. The subject report was originally printed October 1949, after approval by the Commission at Meeting 320, October 20, 1949 (AEC 180/1).

2. In January 1951, the Superintendent of Documents notified the Division of Information Services that he had almost sold out a 3,000-copy printing of the report and that, since demand was continuing, he planned a reprint order of 2,000 copies. He asked whether the AEC wished to bring the report up-to-date before it was reissued.

3. The revised report was cleared by all Washington divisions. The Office of Classification found "no restricted data," and the Division of Security interposed no objection to publication. The Military Liaison Committee had no "military security objection" to the revisions (Appendix).

4. The distribution of the revised report by the Commission will total 6,000 copies. The cost will be about \$1,000, for which funds are available in the budget. Bound copies of the revised report will be available about September 1951.
